

Footnote Format for an Online Source Examples

- Must include:
- Author's name (*if there is one*) followed by a comma
- Title of the article in quotations followed by a comma inside the quotations
 - Subtitle (*if there is one*) follows the title. Preceded by a colon.
- Name of the Website in italics followed by year in parenthesis (if there is one) followed by a comma
- The URL address
- (accessed date) followed by a period
 - Month (spelled out), day (number), and year
