1. Explain the two key pieces of legislation that comprised the Nuremberg Laws and provide examples of what each imposed on the German population.

The Nuremberg Laws were comprised two parts: the Law for Protection of German Blood and Honor and the Reich Citizenship Law of November 1935. The Law for the Protection of German Blood and Honor "forbade marriage or sexual relations between Jews and 'Aryan' Germans." The Reich Citizenship Law was used to determine who in German society was Jewish and who was a pure Aryan. This was determined by the religion of the individual's grandparents. "People with three or more grandparents of the Jewish faith counted as Jewish."
